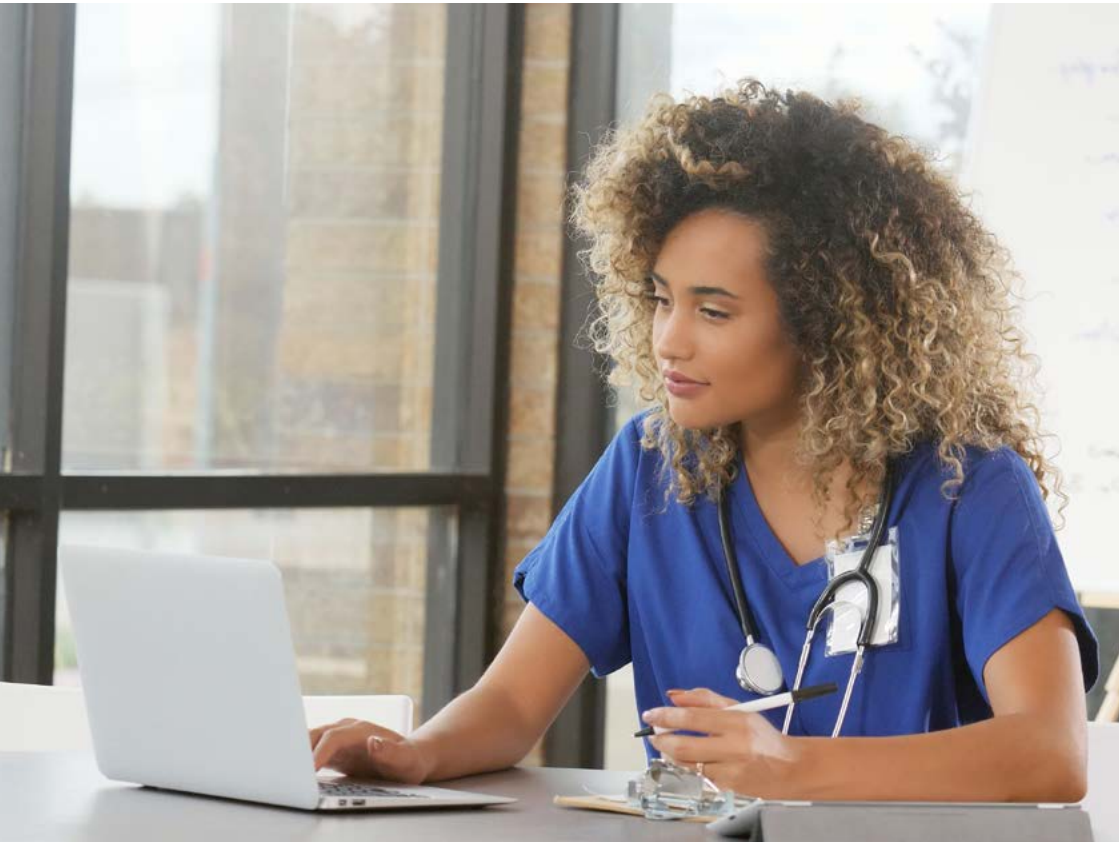




European Board Examination in Emergency Medicine



Establish your level of competence in Emergency Medicine



What is the European Board Examination in Emergency Medicine

EBEEM is a two-part **virtual examination (Part A and Part B)** based on the European Training Requirements (curriculum) endorsed by the European Union of Medical Specialists. The exam is designed to **confirm your suitability for independent practice as an emergency specialist or consultant within any country in the European Union.**

In passing this exam, you are qualified to provide **clinical leadership** in the emergency department.

- **The Part A exam** assesses the knowledge basis for Emergency Medicine practice including basic sciences applied to Emergency Medicine with 120 questions in 2,5 hours.
- **The Part B exam** assesses the clinical skills, behaviours and knowledge required for independent practice in adults and children including pre-hospital care as described in the curriculum. This exam takes 2,5 hours and is divided into 8 stations of which 4 oral examinations and 4 practical examinations.

The exam is a **joint collaboration** between **EUSEM** and **UEMS*** section of Emergency Medicine. UEMS is the European Union of Medical Specialists.

UEMS sets standards for high quality healthcare practice that are transmitted to the Authorities and Institutions of the EU and the National Medical Associations stimulating and encouraging them to implement its recommendations.

The EBEEM certificate is certified proof of your abilities as an EM specialist; **a quality label on your CV.**

Who can take the exam?

To be eligible to take the EBEEM exam you need to be working in EM or in a training programme in Emergency Medicine.

Want to be an examiner?

We are always looking for new examiners. The examiners duties are:

- Writing MCQ questions and Clinical scenario's.
- Examining during the Part B exam at least once every two years for 3 consecutive days.
- Teaching on future examiners workshops.
- Joining in meetings, rehearsals and promotional activities.

Being an examiner can boost your CV, your teaching skills and your network. You can receive a CPD certificate as an examiner.

Important Announcement

Changes to EBEEM exam from 2024

The Emergency Medicine Examination Reference Group for Europe (EMERGE) which is responsible for organisation and development of the EBEEM exam, is announcing some changes in the format and delivery of the exam. These changes will be implemented in 2024.

Currently, Part A consists of one online MCQ paper with 120 single best answer questions. The duration of this paper is 2 ½ hours. From spring 2024, the Part A will consist of two online papers held on the same day. Each paper will have 100 single best answer MCQs. The duration of these papers will be two hours each with a break between the two papers.

Currently, the Part B exam consists of 4 Structured Oral Examinations (SOEs) and 4 Structured Clinical Examinations (SCEs) held online. From autumn 2024, the Part B exam will consist of 6 expanded SOEs.
